23	1) Sheaffer & Roland
24	a. Report from Sheaffer & Roland
25	Engineer Fowler summarized his report. Engineer Fowler states this is the second time the
26	entry fence at the Bartlett Rd Lift Station has been cut. He suggested installing a camera to
27	mitigate the risk of trespassing. The committee will consider this further.

29	b. Recommended Replacement of Mercury Switch on Vacuum Pump System with BN Controls
30	Discussion ensued on the estimates for the Lead Mercury Switch for \$1,150.00 and the Water
31	Treatment Plant Vacuum Pump for \$1,671.00 (including pump cost and labor - see new

# 4) Breakaway Masonry and Driveway Monuments

Building Officer Moreland presented his report to the Committee. Committee members requested Building Officer Moreland speak with Village Attorney Storino about the legality of recommending these monuments to the residents and present an update to the Committee next meeting.

## STAFF REPORTS

#### Administrator – Robert Palmer

Village Engineer Natalie Karney presented the Administrator's report in his absence.

1) <u>Painting 19 Street Sign Poles</u>: Village Administrator Palmer will meet with the vendor once more before his begins painting the street sign poles.

2) <u>Repainting of Dry Hydrants</u>: Engineer Fowler reported Sheaffer & Roland has been researching a different kind of paint that can potentially adhere better to the dry hydrants.

3) <u>Conservancy Pipes</u>: Building Officer Moreland reported that the culvert pipe for the Conservancy area has been ordered.

4) <u>Spring Creek Subdivision</u>: Spring Creek HOA has reached out to Village Administrator Palmer about planting privacy trees in order to mitigate the risk of burglary for an individual homeowner. Administrator Palmer offered a meeting with Police Chief Roman to HOA – no further follow-up.

#### Building Officer – Michael Moreland

1) <u>5 Windsor Court</u>: A pipe in the right-of-way was tipped up and causing the water level of lake not to drain properly. Cuba Township assisted Building Officer Moreland with realigning pipe at the cost of \$405.00 to the Village.

 2) <u>Stoneridge</u>: The Stoneridge subdivision's detention pond pipe drains in a nearby farm and complaints have been received about a higher than normal water level. Building Officer went out with contractor and found there was an obstruction. Newberg Construction was on-site to help clear the obstruction at no cost.

 3) <u>Pinetree Estates</u>: The pond drainage pipe has been obstructed by roots of three trees (one tree is on the Village right-of-way, the other two belong to the subdivision). According to the CC&Rs, the HOA is responsible for storm sewers maintenance. Division of root removal and labor cost will depend on which of the trees are causing the obstruction, once the area has been unearthed.

## Village Engineer – Natalie Karney

1) <u>Goebbert's Sanitary Service</u>: Goebbert's will start construction of their sanitary service connection on Thursday, March 17. A pre-construction meeting was held Monday, March 14.

2	2) Well Program: The drilling of the monitoring well at The Conservancy is scheduled for Thursday,
3	March 17.

5	3) ComEd Grant: The ComEd Grant application was sent in today.

7	4) Park District: The South Barrington Park District wants to demolish and replace buildings on the
8	Tennis Club Ln site. There is a requirement that the area coverage by buildings and structures
9	cannot exceed 19%. Village Engineer Karney will discuss this with the Park District's engineer on
10	this project, Todd Shaffer of Haeger Engineering, and confirm with him that the plans do not exceed
11	the 19% maximum.
12	
13	5) Nathan's Glen: A house plan has been submitted for review by the developer, but the subdivision
14	has not yet been annexed into the Village. Village Engineer Karney is drafting a document that lists
15	all of the code variances needed for the lots in preparation for the proposed annexation.
