Subject: South Barrington 2017 Road Improvement Program

Dear Resident,

The contractor has been working on several tasks in preparation for final asphalt surface placement. While it is inherently subject to site conditions and weather, the anticipated schedule is as follows:

May 22 – May 27

Staking and ditch improvements on Overbrook Road and Mohawk Drive

Patching on Overbrook and Watergate

Level binder on East Cove

Final asphalt surface on East Cove, Polo Drive, Watergate Drive, Overbrook Road

The Contractor's normal workday and hours of operation are 7:00a.m. to 8:00p.m. Monday through Friday with no starting of construction equipment before 7:00a.m. The Contractor does have the option of working on Saturdays between the hours of 8:00a.m. to 6:00p.m. The Contractor will be performing lawn restoration along the road edge where needed shortly after final asphalt placement.

During construction, portions of the roads and driveways may be blocked during normal working hours; however, residents should not have difficulty gaining access to their property. We do not anticipate access issues or delays for any extended period of time. The Village and Contractor will make every effort to expedite this project to minimize inconvenience. We appreciate your patience and understanding while the improvements are completed. The project schedule may be modified dependent on weather and other adverse conditions.

AWARDED CITIZENS FOR CONSERVATION'S HIGHEST HONOR

At their Annual Meeting March 9, 2017, the Citizens for Conservation Board awarded local South Barrington resident Diane Bodkin their highest conservation award, the William H. Miller Award for Conservation, in recognition of her vision and leadership in conservation and restoration in the South Barrington Conservancy.

Peggy Simonsen, past President, presented the award, stating Bodkin originally came to the Conservancy commission in 2010 offering her photography skills to teach children's classes. Frank Munao, Mayor at that time, asked her to chair the commission in 2011. Bodkin claims she has put into practice in the Conservancy all the knowledge about conservation



and restoration that she learned from her four years on the Citizens for Conservation Board. She continues to educate the commission and the Village Board on the benefits of native plants, controlled burns, invasive eradication, avoidance of insecticides, securing volunteers and grants for extra assistance.

Throughout the past five years, the Conservancy Commission has enlarged and extended the network of trails and paths, beautified the entrance mound with a mixture of native and non-native plants, created a Butterfly Garden and Pollinator Garden with native plantings, enlisted the aid of local Eagle Scouts to install ten bluebird nesting boxes and a sturdy attractive observation platform over

the large pond, initiated the first controlled burn and a plan for subsequent burns, obtained two classy huts from Barrington Area Community Foundation and Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club for serving refreshments and distributing educational brochures, and coordinated photography classes for children and adults. Many South Barrington residents and businesses are aware of the annual Scarecrow Trail Walk that the Conservancy has hosted each October for the past five years free to the public.

Bodkin credits her commissioners, Nancy Munao, Corinne Chrystal, and Michael Niedzinski, the ecologist Dustin Wire, the South Barrington Village Staff and Administration, the South Barrington Garden Club, several high school students and Eagle Scout candidates, the LL Bean "Meetup" support, and of course, her husband, Jim Bodkin, for making all the current accomplishments happen.

She envisions many more future projects for the Conservancy: an ADA ramp and asphalt path connecting to the observation deck, durable tree labels to help visitors identify the native trees, adding hundreds of more native plants to the pollinator gardens and Sedge Meadow, initiating annual celebrations of Arbor Day, updating the Conservancy brochure and trail map, and creating a strong Friends of the Conservancy group.
