Election Judges

- Work together to ensure their polling place is running smoothly and voters are properly served.
- This position earns \$190.

Equipment Managers

- Work directly with the election judges to assist voters and ensure their polling place is running smoothly.
- Equipment managers also have more responsibility for setting up and maintaining the voting equipment.
- Due to the additional responsibility, Equipment Managers receive more training and higher pay.

Students

- The Clerk's office offers paid positions to students who serve in suburban Cook County polling places. High school juniors and seniors and college students can earn \$190 for assisting voters as an Election Judge. College students may also apply for a \$340 Equipment Manager position.

BCFPD to Host March 3rd Blood Drive, Car Seat Safety Check

LAKE BARRINGTON, IL—Donate blood and give the “gift of life” Saturday, March 3rd, at a community blood drive hosted by the Barrington Countryside Fire Protection District. The event will run from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., at BCFPD Station 1 (22222 N. Pepper Road, Lake Barrington).

The Department will also offer complimentary child car seat safety checks from 9 a.m. – noon. Certified technicians will confirm that seats are properly installed and answer any questions guests may have.

To schedule an appointment to donate blood, contact LifeSource at 877-543-3768, or visit www.lifesource.org (use sponsor code 763A). Appointments are recommended.

Donors should eat a healthy meal at least two hours before their appointment, drink plenty of non-caffeinated beverages in the days leading up to the donation, and get plenty of rest the night before.

Facts About Blood Donation*:

- One unit of donated blood can help up to three people.
- The shelf life for donated blood products is limited – ranging from five days (platelets) to one year (plasma). Therefore, new donations are always needed.
- Nearly 40% of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, but less than 10% do so.
- Blood cannot be manufactured. It is only available through donor generosity.

Q: ARE YOU FEEDING YOUR MEDICATIONS TO THE FISH?

A: YOU COULD BE -- IF YOU ARE NOT PROPERLY DISPOSING OF EXPIRED OR UNUSED PHARMACEUTICALS!

An increasing number of drinking water sources across the country contain traces of pharmaceuticals. Currently the levels are not known to affect human health, but studies show that these contaminated water supplies are negatively affecting aquatic life. Additionally, putting antibiotics into the environment aids in the development of drug-resistant germs. The Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG) advocates taking steps to protect our community's groundwater from pharmaceutical contamination.

Do not flush or toss!

Flushing old and unused medication creates an easy avenue for groundwater contamination. Septic systems and municipal wastewater treatment plants do not remove all pharmaceutical components, and the water released from a treatment plant or a private septic system contains remnants of flushed medications that may enter the groundwater.

Throwing medicine away with the trash also is not a safe practice. Landfills produce a liquid by-product that is comprised of everything in the landfill including pharmaceuticals, which can enter surface waterways or leach directly into the ground and our drinking water.

Where can I dispose of my pharmaceuticals?

Dispose of your pharmaceuticals at an official take-back location. The Barrington Police Department, along with many other police departments and public service buildings in the BACOG area, collect unused pharmaceuticals.

Residents of the BACOG region are fortunate to have a number of collection facilities within close proximity. Please take advantage of them and help protect our drinking water.

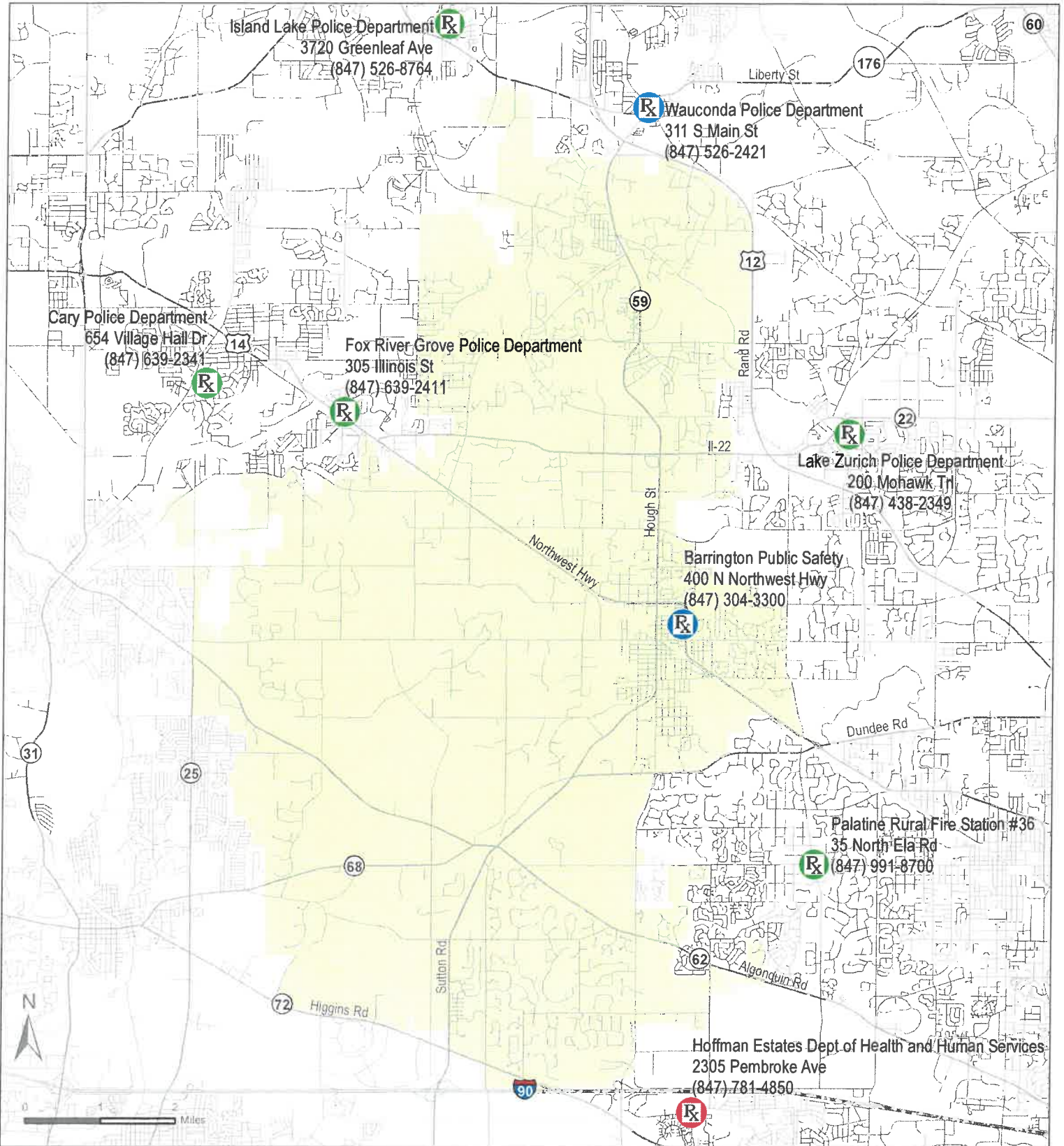
